## EDUCATION 6504 – MUSICIANSHIP, PEDAGOGY AND LEARNING

**ED 6504** will be offered in a **blended format** with FOUR (on campus) seminar/workshop days, (**January** and **March**), supplemented by online components throughout the Winter Semester. While in-person attendance at workshop sessions with peers is preferable, this version of the course may be able to accommodate attendance through live-streaming as well.

**ED 6504** is one of a suite of **required** courses for the Music Education focus area – <u>Masters of Education in Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning Studies</u>. This course may also be taken as an **elective** for other graduate programs in areas such as Education and Music

**ED 6504** is designed to increase pedagogical understandings and techniques through the continued development of personal musicianship skills and an examination of the connection between personal musicianship and the classroom. The course will explore **strategies for structuring choral and instrumental programs in which students develop a logical sequence of musical understandings as they study musical literature.** A helpful prerequisite for this course is a considerable level of willingness for risk-taking in the areas of aural/keyboard skills and/or vocal/instrumental performance.

## Course Topics include:

- Concepts of 'musicianship' how might 'musicianship' be understood?
- Inclusivity and musicianship
- Components of musicianship and pedagogies that address them
- How do pedagogies for musicianship lead to learning?
- How do we know when learning is occurring?
- What can we do if we find that learning is not occurring?
